### Sonshine & Laughter Summer Camp COVID-19 Enhanced Protocols

Our enhanced health and safety protocols align with CDC recommendations, as well as state and local requirements. We continue to consult with experts and monitor updated guidance to ensure our protocols evolve with new learning around COVID -19, so that students, families, and teachers are protected.

### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

#### **Health Screenings, Face Coverings,**

All campers will be prescreened (temperatures taken and answering questions) before entering the campus. If a camper has a temperature of 100.4 or more, he/she will not be permitted on campus and will need to stay home for at least 48 hours. If flu-like symptoms develop, the camper will have to stay home for 10-14 days and communicate with Loving Savior.

If a camper will be traveling out of state, the recommendation is to quarantine for 7 - 10 days when returning to California.

Parents or family members will not be permitted to enter the facility past the school office.

All staff will wear face coverings at all times. All students are required to wear a face covering to camp as well. Face coverings will be worn in the classrooms and outside.

**Effective June 15: All staff and students will continue to wear face coverings indoors. All staff and students are permitted to be without face coverings during outdoor activities. (Students that want to continue to wear face coverings outside will be allowed to do so.**

**Health Department: All persons (students/staff/parents, etc) , regardless of vaccination status will need to continue wearing face coverings indoors while in K-12, childcare or other youth settings effective June 15.**

Partitions have been placed in the office for limited contact with office staff. Floor signs will be displayed in bathrooms to ensure students remain at least 6 feet apart in line to wash hands.

The students will be kept in assigned in their class, grade-level cohorts throughout the day. The students will have access to the playground equipment within their cohorts. The equipment will

be sprayed and sanitized after each use. The students will have access to, assigned and labeled, individual balls and jump ropes for outdoor use.

### **Drop-off and Pick-up Procedures**

Regular check-in time will be from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. at the gate. At this point, the staff will perform daily health screens and temperature checks on adults and children before entering our facility.

After 9:00 a.m., please ring the bell at the gate, a staff member will come and greet you, perform the health screening and check temperatures, before entering our facility.

For Pick-up, please ring the bell at the gate, a staff member will call for your student and your student will be accompanied to the gate.

### **DISTANCING AND CLASSROOM SIZE**

Students and staff will practice physical distancing by keeping at least 3 feet apart. Classroom sizes have been reduced to 20- 24 students to 1 staff member. Class cohorts will be consistent and stay together throughout the day with the same staff member.

Cohorts will eat snack and lunch in the same area but will be appropriately distanced, according to the CDC. Groupings will not share common areas during the day.

Students will not share objects or toys. Students will have their own supply box with materials they will need throughout the day. Supply boxes will be cleaned and sanitized every evening and stored in cubbies.

Students will each have their own cubbies so that belongings are separated from one another.

Students will be required to bring their own water container, snacks and lunches, and a beach towel to use for outdoor activities.

### **CLEANING AND DISINFECTING**

Our facility uses CDC/EPA-approved disinfectants.

Students and staff will be required to wash their hands multiple times a day using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Hand sanitizer, that contains at least 60% alcohol, will be readily available at all times in the classrooms, bathrooms, outside areas, lunch areas, and teacher workspaces.

Hourly cleaning and disinfecting of touched surfaces and objects (e.g., door handles, sink handles, desks, countertops, light switches, toys, outdoor equipment) will be maintained during camp hours.

Before and after hour cleaning and disinfecting of all touched surfaces and objects will be performed as well.

## **STOP THE SPREAD OF GERMS**

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, students shall stay home if they are sick.

Employees who are sick or display COVID-19 like symptoms shall stay home as well.

Parents are asked to notify the school, if their child becomes sick, exudes COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, or shortness of breath), or has been exposed to someone with symptoms or a positive test confirmation.

Students and/or staff will not be permitted to return to school until they have met CDC's criteria to discontinue home isolation. This shall be in the form of medical clearance.

If a student displays a fever at camp, parents will be notified immediately, to come pick up their child, within one hour. The student will not be able to return to camp before a 48-hour, fever-free period.

Cleaning and disinfecting of all areas will be conducted in a safe and timely manner.

Reminders:

- do not touch eyes, noses, and mouths with unwashed hands
- always cover mouths and noses with a tissue when coughing or sneezing
- use the inside of elbows when tissue is not available

### \*\*\*REMINDER\*\*\*

- \* If your student travels outside of the state or country at any time this summer, the student needs to self-quarantine for 7-10 days. The student will then need to meet CDC's criteria to discontinue home isolation and return to camp.

\*\*\*In order to come back to campus:

If the student is Covid-19 tested after 3 days of returning home and the result is negative, the student can return to camp in 7 days.

If the student does not test, the student may return to camp after 10 days, if symptom free.

We will continue to update health and safety practices in response to the pandemic and be in constant communication with our families. Thank you for entrusting Loving Savior to care for and provide a safe and positive, summer camp environment.

## Loving Savior Return to School Protocol

Due to restrictions and guidelines placed on the school from San Bernardino County and California health authorities, Loving Savior Lutheran School has temporarily created the following to ensure safety and well-being of our students, staff and families.

We at Loving Savior understand that this is a difficult time, and we want to be as accommodating as possible, while providing quality Christian education to all of our students. Please understand that these guidelines may seem extreme, unpopular, or very different from our normal setting, but as stated above, these are the safety and well-being of our students and staff, and will be temporary changes.

(Loving Savior Lutheran School Protocols) – For Your Information

### **I. Staying home when appropriate**

A. Staff and families should stay at home if you are experiencing the following symptoms:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

B. If you live in a community where COVID-19 is or might be spreading (currently, that is virtually everywhere in the United States)

Be alert for symptoms. Watch for **fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.**

- Take your temperature if symptoms develop.
- Practice [social distancing](#). Maintain 6 feet of distance from others, and stay out of crowded places.
- Follow [CDC guidance](#) if symptoms develop.

If you feel healthy but:

C. [Recently had close contact](#) with a person with COVID-19

### **Stay Home and Monitor Your Health**

*(Quarantine)*

- Stay home until 14 days after your last exposure.
- Check your temperature twice a day and watch for symptoms of COVID-19.
- If possible, stay away from people who are at [higher-risk](#) for getting very sick from COVID-19.

If you:

D. Have been diagnosed with COVID-19, or  
Are waiting for test results, or has cough, fever, or shortness of breath, or [other symptoms](#) of COVID-19

### **Isolate Yourself from Others**

*(Isolation)*

- Stay home until [it is safe to be around others](#).**
- If you live with others, stay in a specific “sick room” or area** and away from other people or animals, including pets. Use a separate bathroom, if available.
- Read important information about [caring for yourself](#) or [someone else who is sick](#), including when it’s safe to end home isolation.
- If a staff member, student, or immediate family member tests positive for COVID-19, you must stay home for 14 days and receive a clearance from a doctor indicating that you are negative for COVID-19 and are clear to return to school.

If you:

E. Recently traveled from somewhere outside the United States or on a cruise ship or river boat

## II. Plan to Address Positive COVID-19 cases or Community Surges

- A. In accordance with the CDHP guidance, when a student, teacher, or staff member of their household tests positive for COVID-19 and has exposed others at the school, Loving Savior will follow the following steps:
- If a student shows signs of illness, the child will be sent to the office for evaluation.
  - Students will have their temperature taken and symptoms assessed.
  - Students with a temperature of 100.4 are not allowed to return to school until the student is fever-free for 24 hours without temperature-altering medication (such as Tylenol or fever-reducing medicine)
  - If COVID-19 symptoms are recognized, a medical evaluation may be necessary.
  - If a confirmed case of COVID-19 has caused exposure to the school the following protocols will occur:
    1. In consultation with the local public health officials, the principal and other school officials may consider whether school closure is warranted and length of time based on the risk level within the specific community as determined by the local public health officer.
    2. In accordance with standard guidance for isolation at home after close contact, the classroom or office where the COVID-19 positive individual was based will typically need to close temporarily as students or staff isolate. If a staff member or student has been exposed, please follow the quarantine protocol listed in previous section. After 14 days after last exposure, and exhibiting no COVID-19 symptoms, the student or staff member may return. Upon return, the staff member or student must report to the office for a health check before entering the classroom.
    3. Additional close contacts at school outside of a classroom, Loving Savior students or staff should isolate at home for 14 days.
    4. If additional areas of the school are visited by the COVID-19 positive individual, that area may be closed temporarily for cleaning and disinfecting.
    5. During quarantine/isolation of a classroom or school, distance learning will resume through live instruction. Chromebooks will be checked out during quarantine so that no one is left behind. After the 14 days, students and staff will return to the classroom.
    6. **If a student/family member/staff test positive while in quarantine/isolation, they will be responsible for calling Loving Savior and speaking to the COVID-19 coordinator.**
    7. A determination as to when it has been deemed safe to return to school will be made on a case-by-case-basis in accordance with the

health officials. As soon as it is deemed safe to open, parents will be notified and school will resume.

8. Confidentiality will be observed under all circumstances. Staff members will not be permitted to give permitted to give personal information to anyone about a student, staff member or school family. Because we are a Christian community, we will continue to prat for those who are ill, but will not tolerate accusations, misinformation or sharing of personal information.
