

Loving Savior Return to School Protocol 2021-2022

Due to restrictions and guidelines placed on the school from San Bernardino County and California health authorities, Loving Savior Lutheran School has temporarily created the following to ensure safety and well-being of our students, staff and families.

We at Loving Savior understand that this is a difficult time, and we want to be as accommodating as possible, while providing quality Christian education to all of our students. Please understand that these guidelines may seem extreme, unpopular, or very different from our normal setting, but as stated above, these are the safety and well-being of our students and staff, and will be temporary changes.

I. Staying home when appropriate

A. Staff and families should stay at home if you are experiencing the following symptoms:

- o Fever or chills
- o Cough
- o Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- o Fatigue
- o Muscle or body aches
- o Headache
- o New loss of taste or smell
- o Sore throat
- o Congestion or runny nose
- o Nausea or vomiting
- o Diarrhea

B. If you live in a community where COVID-19 is or might be spreading (currently, that is virtually everywhere in the United States)

Be alert for symptoms. Watch for **fever, cough, shortness of breath, or [other symptoms](#) of COVID-19.**

- Take your temperature if symptoms develop.
- Practice [social distancing](#) when feasible. Practice physical distancing requirements when in crowded places.
- Follow [CDC guidance](#) if symptoms develop.

If you feel healthy but:

C. **Recently had close contact** with a person with COVID-19

Stay Home and Monitor Your Health

(Vaccinated)

- Self-monitoring - if no symptoms, they may continue to attend school
- Undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine

(Unvaccinated)

Unvaccinated students who are in close contact (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet indoors) may undergo a modified quarantine as follows: They may continue to attend school for in-person instruction if they:

- Quarantine **with** testing:
 - Quarantine for 5 days. You can exit quarantine **on Day 6** after last exposure if you have no symptoms and you have a negative COVID test collected on DAY 5 or later.
 - (Of note, **DAY 0** is the day of your last exposure to an infected person. Day 1 is the first full day after your last exposure.
- Quarantine **without** testing
 - If you do not test, you can exit quarantine on Day 11 after last exposure as long as you do not have symptoms.
 - (Of note, **DAY 0** is the day of your last exposure to an infected person. Day 1 is the first full day after your last exposure.

Both close contacts with a COVID 19 positive person regardless if you tested or no testing must follow the following guidance:

- **Monitor symptoms for 10 days after your last exposure**
 - If you develop symptoms, you must isolate and test immediately.
 - If your test is positive, continue to isolate. Follow the COVID 19 positive instructions. Your isolation period begins the day your symptoms start.
 - If your test is negative, you can return to school, once you have completed your quarantine period and have been fever free for 24 hours.
- **Wear a mask while around others, indoors and outdoors for 10 days after your last exposure.**
 - Students should wear a well-fitting, non-cloth mask of multiple layers of woven material with a nose wire.

- o Adults should wear a well-fitting mask, non-cloth mask of multiple layers of woven material with a nose wire, preferable medical grade mask (surgical)

If symptoms develop during the quarantine period, the exposed person must immediately isolate, get tested, and contact their healthcare provider with any questions regarding their care. If the quarantine contact tests positive or experiences symptoms the following must be followed:

- Stay home until 10 days after on-set of symptoms.
- Check your temperature twice a day and watch for symptoms of COVID-19.
- If possible, stay away from people who are at [higher-risk](#) for getting very sick from COVID-19.

If you:

D. Have been diagnosed or suspected to have COVID-19, or

Are waiting for test results, or has cough, fever, or shortness of breath, or [other symptoms](#) of COVID-19, please follow the following 3 scenarios:

1. I Have Symptoms of COVID 19

- a. Stay at home Until:
 - i. You get results from a COVID 19 PCR test (not a rapid test) OR
 - ii. 10 days after symptoms started or cleared by a physician
- b. **If Positive**, follow the I'M COVID 19 Positive with symptoms below.
- c. **If Negative**, stay home until fever free for 24 hours and symptoms have improved.

2. I'm COVID19 Positive with Symptoms:

- a. Stay at home until:
 - i. At least **5 days** have passed since your symptoms started **AND**
 - ii. You have a **negative rapid antigen** COVID test collected **on day 5** or later **AND**
 - iii. You have not had a fever for at least 24 hours **AND**
 - iv. Your symptoms are improving

OR

- v. Stay at home **for 10 days** after your symptoms started **AND**
- vi. You have not had a fever for at least 24 hours **AND**
- vii. Your symptoms are improving

- b. (of note, your first day of symptoms is Day 0. Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms started. A PCR test is not recommended for repeat testing following a COVID infection)

3. I'm COVID 19 Positive with NO Symptoms

a. Stay at home until

- i. At least **5 days have passed** since the day your initial positive test was taken **AND**
- ii. You have a negative rapid antigen COVID test collected **on day 5 or later**

OR

- iii. Stay at home **for 10 days** after your first initial positive test was taken.
- iv. (of note, Day 0 is the day your positive test was taken. A PCR test is not recommended for repeat testing.

4. Must wear a mask for 10 days

a. Wear a mask while around others, indoors and outdoors for a total of 10 days.

- b. Students should wear a well-fitting, non-cloth mask of multiple layers of woven material with a nose wire.
- c. Adults should wear a well-fitting mask, non-cloth mask of multiple layers of woven material with a nose wire, preferable medical grade mask (surgical)

II. Plan to Address Positive COVID-19 cases or Community Surges

- A. In accordance with the CDHP guidance, when a student, teacher, or staff member of their household tests positive for COVID-19 and has exposed others at the school, Loving Savior will follow the following steps:
 - If a student shows signs of illness, the child will be sent to the office for evaluation.
 - Students will have their temperature taken and symptoms assessed.
 - Students with a temperature of 100.4 are not allowed to return to school until the student is fever-free for 24 hours without temperature-altering medication (such as Tylenol or fever-reducing medicine)
 - If COVID-19 symptoms are recognized, a medical evaluation may be necessary.

- If a confirmed case of COVID-19 has caused exposure to the school the following protocols will occur:
 1. In consultation with the local public health officials, the principal and other school officials may consider whether school closure is warranted and length of time based on the risk level within the specific community as determined by the local public health officer.
 2. In accordance with standard guidance for isolation at home after close contact, the classroom or office where the COVID-19 positive individual was based will typically need to close temporarily as students or staff isolate. If a staff member or student has been exposed, please follow the quarantine protocol listed in previous section. If the student/staff member is quarantined at home, they must follow the aforementioned protocol. Upon return, the staff member or student must report to the office for a health check before entering the classroom.
 3. Additional close contacts at school outside of a classroom, Loving Savior students or staff should follow the aforementioned protocol. These protocols will be strictly enforced, especially with unvaccinated students/staff.
 4. If additional areas of the school are visited by the COVID-19 positive individual, that area may be closed temporarily for cleaning and disinfecting.
 5. During quarantine/isolation of a classroom or school, distance learning will resume through live instruction. Chromebooks will be checked out during quarantine so that no one is left behind. After the 10 days, students and staff will return to the classroom.
 6. ***If a student/family member/staff test positive while in quarantine/isolation, they will be responsible for calling Loving Savior and speaking to the COVID-19 coordinator.***
 7. A determination as to when it has been deemed safe to return to school will be made on a case-by-case-basis in accordance with the health officials. As soon as it is deemed safe to open, parents will be notified and school will resume.
 8. Confidentiality will be observed under all circumstances. Staff members will not be permitted to give personal information to anyone about a student, staff member or school family. Because we are a Christian community, we will continue

to prat for those who are ill, but will not tolerate accusations, misinformation or sharing of personal information.

III. Campus Access

- A. Staff and Students entering Campus **Morning Drop-off**: NO PARENTS WILL BE ALLOWED TO COME ONTO CAMPUS FROM 7:30-8:15 for morning drop off time.
- a. Passive Screening: Staff, teachers, and Students will self-screen before leaving for work (check temperature to ensure temperatures are below 100 degree Fahrenheit, check for symptoms outlines by public health officials) using our HealthTrac app. The HealthTrac app will alert anyone who exhibits symptoms consistent with COVID-19 to stay home or if they have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19.
 - B. Active Screening: Loving Savior will screen all staff, teachers and students who have not pre-screened themselves prior to school. Each student will be screened and will receive temperature checks with a non-touch thermometer and will be asked the COVID-19 symptoms checklist questions.
 - C. All staff, teachers, students, and visitors must wash or sanitize their hands prior to entering campus. Loving Savior will have a sanitizing station for all Loving Savior Community members.
 - D. Loving Savior will provide various points of access to campus depending on grade level.
 - Grades 7-8 will enter and exit campus through the locker bay (east side located where the emergency gate for preschool is located.)
 - Grade 6 will enter through the southeast gate in the church building.
 - Grade 5 will enter through the gate at the portables located in front of the church.
 - Grades 2-4 will enter through the large gate on the main campus;
 - Kinder-1 will enter through the crash gate located between buildings A and E.
 - E. Grades K-8 Students Arriving Late procedure:
 - We are requesting that parents make every attempt to get students to school on time, particularly during this pandemic situation. It is disruptive to the classroom when students are not on-time to school.
 - If a student arrives after 8:15 a.m. , the parent must call the school upon arrival. Student AND parent will be met outside in the round-about-circle or front gate by a staff member for temperature check clearance. Once approved, the student will be able to enter campus and the classroom.
 - F. **Afternoon Pick Up**: NO PARENTS WILL BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP STUDENT FROM THE CLASSROOM.

- Grades 7-8 will exit campus through the locker bay (east side located where the emergency gate for preschool is located.)
 - Grade 6 will exit through their classroom located in front of their classroom (southeast side of church). Pick up is located in front walkway by church;
 - Grades 2-3 will exit through the large gate on the main campus;
 - Grade 4 will exit through the main gate, but we will be picked up between building A & E (small circular path located next to open grass area by parking lot.
 - Grade 5 will exit through gate (Portable). Pick up will be in front walkway by church.
 - Kinder-1 will exit through the crash gate located between buildings A and E.
- G. Early Pick up Procedure:
- Parents must contact the school office prior to arrival for early pickup.
 - Student will be sent from the classroom to the school office for dismissal.
 - Upon arrival, the student will be escorted to the front gate to be released to their parent.
 - Pick up rules concerning who may pick up a student will still apply. Adults over 18 years old on the student emergency form will be authorized for student pick up.
 1. A written note explaining additional adults authorized to pick up student must be submitted via email or fax to the school office.
 2. Verbal communication to add or change authorization will not be permitted.
- H. If a student is symptomatic while entering campus or during the day,
- Students who develop symptoms of illness while at school should be separated from others right away, isolated in designated area (back office). If more than one student is in our isolation area, they will be physical distant from one another.
 - Any student or staff exhibiting symptoms will be required to immediately wear a face covering and wait in the isolation area until they can be transported home or to a health care facility.
 - Students will remain in isolation with continued monitoring by an adult until picked up by an authorized adult.
 - Loving Savior will advise parents that sick students will not be able to return to school until they have met the CDC criteria to discontinue home isolation (please refer to section **Staying Home When Appropriate**)
 - Those students with underlying health conditions that place them at higher risk for severe illness, please see the school office so an educational plan can be developed.

- I. Outside Visitors and Groups:
 - Loving Savior will have limited access on campus for parents and other visitors.
 - All parents and visitors will go through the active screening process. Each visitor will have their temperature taken by a no-touch thermometer and they will be asked about COVID-19 symptoms and will log into the office and sign off that they exhibit no symptoms. If any COVID-19 symptoms exist, the parent or visitor will be asked to leave the campus. All visitors will be expected to wear face coverings at all times.
 - External Community Organizations must follow the school's health and safety plan and CDPH guidance to use the facility. All temperatures must be checked, must answer all COVID-19 health assessment questions, and sanitation and disinfection of used area is mandatory before and after use. In addition, all external visitors must wear face coverings at all times.
 - Delivery protocol – Delivery provider will be required to wear a face covering before entering school, and staff who receive packages must wash their hands or use hand sanitizer after handling merchandise.

IV: Hygiene

- A. Handwashing
 - a. Students and staff will have opportunities to hand wash frequently throughout the day in accordance to the CDHP and Cal/OSHA guidance.
 - b. Every classroom will have sufficient access to handwashing and hand sanitizer (minimum of 60 percent alcohol). The use of hand sanitizer will be under adult supervision. Each classroom will be equipped with a sink, hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes to sanitize common areas and personal property.
- B. Training of staff and students on proper handwashing techniques and the use of PPE use including the following:
 - a. Scrub hands for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not accessible. Staff and students will use paper towels to dry hands thoroughly. There will be hand washing poster hung in all classrooms and bathrooms by the sinks as a reminder of proper techniques. In addition, CDC videos will be shown to staff and students on proper handwashing techniques.
 - b. Hand washing must be done before leaving to school, arriving for school, leaving school, after eating and preparing food, after activities, after close contact with others, using shared surfaces or tools, before using the restroom, after using the restroom, after blowing nose, coughing or sneezing, and various other times as deemed necessary.
 - c. Students and faculty must follow guidance on proper PPE use. Students and staff will be encouraged to wash their hands before putting on their face covering, put

it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin, try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face, and make sure they can breathe easily.

V. Loving Savior will be offering in-person instruction:

A. Traditional Instruction: 1:1 instruction in the classroom setting; A renewed focus on essential standards and checking for understanding formatively; Continued support for the development of effective technology integration across content; Ensure articulation across grade levels and content areas; Continue to strengthen collaboration through professional learning communities.

VI. Protective Equipment:

A. Protective (PPE) will be available to all students and staff to ensure we meet the needs of all personal health and safety in our school facility.

- i. Loving Savior will require all students and staff to wear a face covering while on campus inside the classroom or inside open common areas. If they have forgotten their face covering, one will be provided to them.
- ii. According to CDC, face coverings are not recommended for anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the covering without assistance. Loving Savior will make reasonable accommodations such as a face shield with a cloth drape for those who are unable to wear face coverings for medical reasons. Per Cal/OSHA, considerations for face shields should include a cloth drape attached across the bottom and tucked into a shirt.

B. Staff Protective Equipment

- i. All Loving Savior staff and teachers will be required to wear face coverings inside. According to CDHP guidance, teachers will be allowed to wear face shields, which will enable our students to see their faces and avoid potential barriers to phonological instruction.
- ii. Loving Savior will provide its employees face coverings if the employee does not have a clean one to wear.
- iii. Loving Savior will provide protective equipment, as appropriate for work assignment.
 1. Front office staff and daycare workers will be provided face coverings and disposable gloves as necessary.
 2. For Custodial Staff, protective equipment and PPR for cleaning and disinfecting will be provided.
 - a. For regular surface cleaning, gloves will be provided for cleaning and disinfecting.

C. Student Protective Equipment

- i. Loving Savior students must wear face covering inside at all times, especially when physical distancing cannot be maintained. Face coverings will be worn:
 - 1. While inside the classroom or in common areas where physical distancing is limited.

VI. Physical Distancing

- A.. Space and seating/desks will be spaced apart to allow for social distancing, when feasible.
- B. All desks will face in the same direction (rather than facing each other) or students will sit on only one side of the table, spaced apart when feasible. If not feasible, masks will be worn at all times, and shields may be used to provide more protection per parents request. Shields will be provided by the parent.
- C. Parents are allowed to bring in physical barriers for student desks (i.e. Plexi Glass Shield)
- E. When physical distancing is difficult, students and staff are required to wear face coverings to mitigate virus spread.
- H. Playground/Outside Spaces/Athletics
 - i. Loving Savior will provide supervision to ensure physical distancing, as feasible.
- I. Lunch
 - i. Food service though Choice Lunch will be individually packaged with students names on them.
 - ii. Each lunch will be individually packaged to eliminate self-service or sharing of food. Daycare staff will limit the amount of students per table to maximize physical distancing as much as possible while eating.
 - iii After each lunch period, students will wash hands or use hand sanitizer and all tables will be cleaned with disinfectant pre/post every lunch period. If students eat inside, tables will be disinfected, students will wash hands, and trash will be removed.

iv. As long as it is safe to do so, students will take their lunch outside.

- J. If weather becomes an issue, students will eat lunch in the classrooms.
- If the temperature at 11:00 a.m. is higher than 98 degrees or higher, students will remain inside.
 - If it is raining at 11:00 a.m., to the point that tables are getting wet, the students will remain inside.

K. Staff

- i. Staff breakroom and an outside area for eating have been established to maintain appropriate physical distance from one another when feasible.
- ii. Staff meetings, trainings, and staff development will be conducted either virtually or via in-person in a larger room to
- iii. Office staff is spaced apart within the CDC guidelines and a physical barrier has been added for the reception area to safeguard our employees. L. Chapel services will be held in the chapel. Face coverings will be mandatory.

M. library will be offered for checking out books. Computer lab will be offered. Face coverings will be mandatory.

O. Classes will be assigned a playground zone and are expected to remain within its perimeter to meet social distancing guidelines.

P. External teachers will report to the classroom to teach classes (Spanish)

VII. Cleaning and Disinfecting

A. All sharing of electronics, toys, books and other games and learning aids will be prohibited until otherwise directed by CDC.

B. Loving Savior staff will disinfect surfaces between uses according to CDC guidelines.

The following surfaces will be disinfected:

- Desks and tables
- Chairs
- Keyboards, phones, headsets, copy machines
- Toys

- Pencil sharpener, stapler
- C. Loving Savior Staff will disinfect the following surfaces (high touch services) frequently throughout the day.
- Door handles
 - Drinking fountains
 - Sink handles
 - Restroom surfaces
 - Toys, games, instructional materials, art supplies
- D. Loving Savior will choose disinfecting products approved by the EPA to use against COVID-19.
- E. Loving Savior will clean and air out the facility when children are not present.
- F. When a child is sick, they will be placed in an isolation room while waiting for parents to pick up. The area will be disinfected after 24 hours, if feasible.
- G. Loving Savior has regularly scheduled maintenance of all vents and air conditioners throughout the year. They are cleaned, sanitized, and filters are changed.
- H. Drinking fountains will be maintained and checked to ensure that water meets sanitation standards. Students and staff will be encouraged to bring their own water to minimize use and touching of water fountains.
- I. Student belongings in an area that is designated for each student.

VIII. Employee Issues

A. Staff Training

- Staff levels will be sufficient to meet the unique facility cleanliness, physical distancing, student learning, and health and safety needs to address COVID-19.
- Staff will be trained on proper disinfecting in accordance with the Cal/OSHA regulations.
- Staff will maintain physical distancing of students when permissible.
- Staff will be symptom screened and temperature checked daily.
- Staff will be trained on the proper use of PPE equipment, included but not limited to cloth face removal, proper face covering, and importance of washing cloth face coverings.
- Staff will be shown cough and sneeze etiquette, keeping one's hands away from one's face, frequent handwashing and proper technique, and confidentiality around health recording and reporting.
- Staff will be trained on trauma practices and suicide prevention.

- Loving Savior will designate official responsible for responding to COVID-19 concerns.

IX. Communication with students, parents, employee, public health officials and the community

- A. The COVID-19 plan was a collaborative effort with all stakeholders.
- B. Communication and the COVID-19 will be sent to all stakeholders informing them of the new COVID-19 protocols.
 - i. Proper use of PPE
 - ii. Cleanliness and disinfecting
 - iii. Transmission prevention
 - iv. Guidelines when to keep students home from school
 - v. System for self-reporting symptoms (contact COVID-19 coordinator-Mrs. Brandi Krueger)
 - vi. Loving Savior will work with the health department to coordinate closure or part/all school in case of a positive COVID-19. Additionally, sanitation and disinfecting the classroom will be done after 24 hours or before if necessary.
- C. Communication Plan for notification to school for a positive COVID-19 case.
 - i. In accordance with the state and local laws and regulations, school administrators will notify the local health officials, staff and families immediately of any case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
 - ii. Loving Savior will inform those who have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to stay home and self-monitor for symptoms and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.
 - iii. Loving Savior, while the school is closed and distance learning, will provide communicate and a reminder of the importance of community physical distancing measures while the school is close, including discouraging student or staff from gathering elsewhere.
 - iv. Loving Savior will advise sick staff members and children to not return to school until they have met CDC criteria to discontinue home isolation.

X. IEP/ELL/504 Plan Students

- A. Students with IEPs/504 plans will be adhered to and implemented accordingly.
- B. The IEP team will work with the families work jointly to determine what is working for each student.
